Carly Hughes



Carly Hughes is a star of both stage and screen. She is best known for her years of work on Broadway, and for creating the role of Angela the ABC comedy "American Housewife" and Etta Mae on Netflix's "Insatiable". She starred in the Lifetime Holiday movie "The Christmas Edition" and released her first EP of holiday classics titled 'Mistletoe & Carly', following the movie. Other TV credits include: CW's "Dynasty", HBO's "Curb Your Enthusiasm", Netflix's "Malibu Rescue: The Next Wave.", "General Hospital". Her animated

voice over credits include: Disney Jr.'s "Super Kitties", Nickelodeon's "Baby Shark" & "It's Pony". Carly is a 2003 recipient of the prestigious Princess Grace Award for Acting and Excellence in the Arts. She has starred in and been featured in eight Broadway shows. Most recently as Velma Kelly in "Chicago," the Leading Player in "Pippin" and originated Lucille/Shirley of the Shirelles in "Beautiful: The Carole King Musical." She appeared on "The 2014 Tony Awards," "The Today Show" and "The View" to perform her song "Will You Love Me Tomorrow," helping to win the 2015 GRAMMY® for Best Musical Theater Album. Her other Broadway credits include "The Book of Mormon," "Ghost: The Musical," "Ragtime," "The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee" and "Dr. Seuss' How the Grinch Stole Christmas." Hughes has starred at many regional theaters across the country, and you can hear her singing in most of the songs in "Lucky Stiff," the Ahrens & Flaherty movie musical.

Prince Rainier III Award Presenter

Bernadette Peters



Throughout her illustrious career, Bernadette Peters has dazzled audiences and critics with her performances on stage, film and television, in concert, and on recordings. She has garnered numerous accolades including three Tony Awards, a Golden Globe, four Emmy and four Grammy Award nominations and a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.

Best known for her work on stage and one of Broadway's most critically acclaimed performers,

Bernadette just concluded a highly successful West End debut in the Cameron Mackintosh production of *Old Friends*, celebrating the life and work of Stephen Sondheim. The production will transfer to Broadway in Spring 2025.

Bernadette has starred on Broadway in *Hello, Dolly!, Follies, A Little Night Music,* among others. She also appeared in City Center's Encores! Production, *A Bed and a Chair: A New York Love Affair* featuring the music of Stephen Sondheim and orchestrations by Wynton Marsalis.

Peters garnered both the Tony and Drama Desk Award for her performance in Andrew Lloyd Webber's, Song and Dance. She also won a Tony for her performance in the revival of Irving Berlin's Annie Get Your Gun. She received Tony nominations for her outstanding performances on Broadway in Sam Mendes' revival Gypsy, Neil Simon's The Goodbye Girl, Stephen Sondheim's Pulitzer Prize-winning musical Sunday in the Park with George, the Jerry Herman/Gower Champion ode to the movies, Mack and Mabel, and the Leonard Bernstein/Comden and Green musical On The Town. Peters also earned a Drama Desk nomination for her unforgettable portrayal of the Witch in Stephen Sondheim's Into the Woods.

She also enjoys a career which boasts an impressive list of television credits, most recently the Apple TV+ series, "High Desert", NBC-TV's "Zoey's Extraordinary Playlist" for which she earned an Emmy nomination. The popular series was made into a TV movie musical titled "Zoey's Extraordinary Christmas" for The Roku Channel. Other TV appearances include "The CW's "Katy Keene"; CBS All Access' "The Good Fight"; and Amazon Prime's Golden Globe winning series,

"Mozart in the Jungle".

Additional television credits include NBC-TV's "Smash," ABC-TV's "Grey's Anatomy" and "Ugly Betty. In addition to starring in the Lifetime TV movie *Living Proof*, Peters has lit up the silver screen in over 30 films throughout her distinguished career. She received a Golden Globe Award for her memorable performance in "Pennies From Heaven." Other film credits include *The Jerk, The Longest Yard, Silent Movie, Annie, Pink Cadillac, Slaves of New York*, Woody Allen's *Alice, Impromptu, It Runs in the Family, Coming Up Roses, The Broken Hearts Gallery* and most recently, a surprise appearance in the popular Jonathan Larson biopic, *tick, tick...BOOM!*

Bernadette has recorded six solo albums, including the Grammynominated I'll Be Your Baby Tonight, Sondheim, Etc.: Bernadette Peters Live at Carnegie Hall, and Bernadette Peters Loves Rodgers & Hammerstein, in addition to numerous original Broadway cast recordings.

Peters devotes her time and talents to numerous events that benefit Broadway Cares/Equity Fights AIDS. Her "pet project" Broadway Barks, co-founded with Mary Tyler Moore, is an annual, star-studded dog and cat adoption event that benefits shelter animals in the New York City and tri-state area.


The American Theater Wing honored her efforts and awarded her with the Isabelle Stevenson Tony Award which recognizes an individual from the theatre community who has made a substantial contribution of volunteered time and effort on behalf of one or more humanitarian, social service or charitable organizations, regardless of whether such organizations relate to the theatre.

This past November, while in London Bernadette presented West End Woofs, a sister organization to Broadway Barks that she cohosted with her good friend, Elaine Paige. The event is the first of its kind in the UK that fostered a spirit of community among animal shelters and rescue groups.

She is a New York Times best-selling author who has penned three children's books: "Broadway Barks", "Stella is a Star", and "Stella and Charlie: Friends Forever". All of her proceeds from the sale of these books benefit Broadway Barks. Peters resides in New York and Los Angeles with her rescue dogs, Charlie and Rosalia.

Michael Douglas



Michael Douglas is a multiaward-winning actor/producer celebrating over 50 years in the entertainment business. Among his artistic achievements are producing the classic multi-Oscar winning film One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, starring in Wall Street, for which he won a Best Actor Oscar, as well as such popular and critical hits as Fatal Attraction, Romancing the Stone, The China Syndrome, Basic Instinct, The American President, Traffic, and Marvel's Ant Man trilogy. Michael also

won an Emmy and Golden Globe as Best Actor for his portrayal of the entertainment icon Liberace in *Behind the Candelabra*.

The son of Kirk and Diana Douglas, Michael graduated from UCSB in 1968 and has made a home in Santa Barbara ever since. He became a trustee of his Alma Mater in 1981 and created the Michael Douglas Visiting Artist Program. He was instrumental in building the Pollack Theatre on the UCSB campus and the lobby is named in his honor. In 2012, he established the Michael Douglas Dean of Humanities and Fine Arts. He has been a supporter of the Santa Barbara Film Festival since its inception in 1986. In 1996, Michael created the Douglas Family Preserve which is seventy acres of land that provide recreational opportunities for the public.

Douglas was named a United Nations Messenger of Peace in 1998 and works continuously in the areas of nuclear non-proliferation and the control of small arms. He sits on the board of the Eugene O'Neill Theatre Center, the Perelman Performing Arts Center of New York, and is a recipient of the American Film Institute's Lifetime Achievement Award as well as the Cannes Film Festival's Palme d'or d'honneur in recognition of his lifelong career and his engagement for cinema.



Michael Esper most recently starred in the Tony Award winning Broadway hit, Appropriate, with Sarah Paulson, and has a recurring role in the Amazon series, Fallout. He plays a supporting role in the recently released film The Creator, for writer/director Gareth Edwards, and starred opposite Rebecca Hall in *Resurrection* (dir. Andrew Semans). Other features include Beau Is Afraid, (dir. Ari Aster), Ben Is Back (dir. Peter Hedges) starring Julia Roberts, *Griffin In Summer* (dir. Nicholas Colia), Runner, Runner (dir. Brad Furman), Frances Ha (dir.

Noah Baumbach), *The Drop* (dir. Michael R. Roskam), *All Good Things* (dir. Andrew Jarecki) and *A Beautiful Mind* (dir. Ron Howard).

Esper was a Series Regular in *Trust* (FX) starring opposite Donald Sutherland and Hilary Swank. He recently filmed a Guest Starring Role in the newly released series, *The Girls On The Bus,* for HBO Max. Recurring Roles include *Florida Man*, (NETFLIX), *Fallout*, (Amazon), *The Outsider* (HBO), *Ray Donovan* and *Nurse Jackie* (Showtime), *The Family* (ABC), *Shades of Blue* (NBC), *Person of Interest, The Good Wife* and *Braindead* (CBS) and has Guest Starred in *Julia* (HBO MAX), *Prodigal Son* (Fox), *Reprisal* (Hulu), *Elementary* (CBS) and *Halt and Catch Fire* (AMC).

Esper has originated several Leading Roles on Broadway and Off including Sting's *The Last Ship*, the Tony nominated production of *The Lyons*, the multiple Tony award winning musical, *American Idiot*, & Roundabout Theater Company's critically acclaimed production of *A Man For All Seasons*. Other New York Theatre credits include *Catch As Catch Can* (New Ohio Theatre), *Lazarus* (NYTW AND London), *The Agony And The Agony, As You Like It* (The Public), *The Intelligent Homosexual's Guide To Capitalism And Socialism With A Key To The Scriptures* (The Public Theatre), *Big Bill* (Lincoln Center Theater), *Assistance, Crazy Mary, Manic Flight Reaction* (Playwrights Horizons), *The Four Of Us* (Manhattan Theatre Club), and subUrbia (Second Stage Theatre), *The Glass Menagerie* (London West End). Regional credits include *Long Day's Journey Into Night* (The Druid Theatre Company & the Dublin Theatre Festival) and *Me, Myself, And I* (The McCarter), *Tales From Red Vienna* (MTC).

Branden Jacobs-Jenkins



Branden Jacobs-Jenkins is a Brooklyn-based writer, theater artist, and producer. His latest work Give Me Carmelita Tropicana! begins performances at Soho Rep this October and, in the spring, his play Purpose transfers to Broadway from its recordbreaking sold out premiere run at Steppenwolf Theater in Chicago where it received 2024 Jeff Awards for Best Production and Best New Work. Other recent theater credits include Appropriate (Broadway), The Comeuppance (Signature Theatre), Girls (Yale Rep), Everybody (Signature Theatre), War (Yale Rep; Lincoln Center/LCT3), Gloria (Vineyard Theatre), Appropriate (Obie Award; Signature Theatre), An Octoroon (Obie Award; Soho Rep, Theatre for a New Audience), and Neighbors (The Public Theater). His work has received Tony, Lortel, Drama League, Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle, and Obie awards. Other honores include a USA Artists fellowship, a Guggenheim fellowship, the MacArthur fellowship, the Windham-Campbell Prize for Drama, and the inaugural Tennessee Williams Award. A Professor in the Practice at Yale University, Branden also serves as Vice President of the Dramatists Guild council and on the boards of Soho Rep, Park Avenue Armory and the Dramatists Guild Foundation.

Lila Neugebauer is a stage and screen director based in Brooklyn, New York. On Broadway, she has directed Branden Jacobs-Jenkins' Appropriate, Kenneth Lonergan's The Waverly Gallery, and Chekhov's Uncle Vanya, in a new adaptation by Heidi Schreck. Recent off-broadway credits include Itamar Moses' *The Ally* (The Public Theater); Simon Stephens' Morning Sun (Manhattan Theatre Club); Tracy Letts' Mary Page Marlow (Second Stage); Annie Baker's The Antipodes, Branden Jacobs-Jenkins' Everybody, Edward Albee's At Home at the Zoo: Homelife / The Zoo Story and works by Albee, Maria Irene Fornes, and Adrienne Kennedy (all at Signature Theatre); Sarah DeLappe's *The Wolves* and Zoe Kazan's *After The* Blast (Lincoln Center Theater). As co-Artistic Director of The Mad Ones, she co-authored and directed Mrs. Murray's Menagerie (Ars Nova) and Miles for Mary (Playwrights Horizons), among other works. TV: "Maid" (Netflix), "The Last Thing He Told Me" (Apple TV+), "The Sex Lives of College Girls," and "Room 104" (HBO Max). Her directorial feature debut Causeway, starring Jennifer Lawrence and Brian Tyree Henry (Oscar nomination) is available on AppleTV+. She is a recipient of the Obie and Drama Desk Awards and was nominated for a Tony for her direction of Appropriate.

Adam Rapp



Adam Rapp is an award-winning playwright/director, novelist, and filmmaker. He is the author of numerous plays, including Nocturne (American Repertory Theatre, New York Theatre Workshop, The Almeida, London, The Traverse, Edinburgh), Faster (Rattlestick), Animals & Plants (A.R.T.), Finer Noble Gases (26th Humana Festival, Rattlestick, Edinburgh Fringe, The Bush, London), Stone Cold Dead Serious (A.R.T., Edge Theatre, NYC), Blackbird (The Bush, London; Edge Theatre), Gompers

(Pittsburgh City Theatre, The Arcola, London), Essential Self-Defense (Playwrights Horizons/Edge Theatre), American Sligo (Rattlestick), Bingo with the Indians (The Flea), Kindness (Playwrights Horizons), *The Metal Children* (The Vineyard), *The* Hallway Trilogy (Rattlestick), The Edge of Our Bodies (36th Humana Festival, The Gate, London), Dreams of Flying Dreams of Falling (The Atlantic), Wolf in the River (The Flea), The Purple Lights of Joppa Illinois (Southcoast Rep, The Atlantic), and Red Light Winter (Steppenwolf, Scott Rudin Productions at Barrow Street Theatre), for which he won Chicago's Jeff Award for Best New Work, an OBIE, and was named a finalist for the 2006 Pulitzer Prize. His production of *Finer Noble Gases* received a Fringe First Award from the 2006 Edinburgh Festival, where he was also named Best Newcomer by The List. That production went on to be performed at London's Bush Theatre. His most recent play, The Sound Inside, which was directed by David Cromer and starred Marylouise Parker, premiered at the 2018 Williamstown Theatre Festival, and then transferred to Broadway, where it enjoyed a six-month sold-out run at Studio 54. The Sound Inside was nominated for six Tony Awards, including Best Play. Parker won the Tony for Best Actress. He most recently penned the book for the musical, *The Outsiders*, for which he received a Tony Award nomination. The Outsiders won Best Musical at the 2024 Tony Awards.

His playwriting honors include Boston's Elliot Norton Award, The Helen Merrill Prize, The 2006 Princess Grace Statue, a Lucille Lortel Playwright's Fellowship, The Benjamin H. Danks Award,

the PEN/Laura Pels International Foundation Award, and most recently, a 2021 Arts and Letters Award from the Academy of Arts and Letters.

He is also the author of thirteen novels, including *Under the Wolf, Under the Dog*, which was a finalist for the LA Times Book Prize, and for which he received the Schneider Family Book Award from the American Library Association, *Punkzilla*, which was named a 2006 Printz Honor Book, and *33 Snowfish*, which Booklist cited as one of the 50 Best Young Adult Novels of All Time. *Know Your Beholder* was published by Little, Brown & Company in 2015. His new novel, *Wolf at the Table*, was published by Little, Brown & Company this past March.

As a filmmaker he wrote and directed *Winter Passing*, starring Ed Harris, Zooey Deschanel, and Will Ferrell, which was produced by Focus Features and was an Official Selection of the 2005 Toronto Film Festival. His second feature, *Blackbird*, which he adapted from his play, stars Paul Sparks, Gillian Jacobs, and Michael Shannon. *Blackbird* premiered at the 2006 Edinburgh International Film Festival, received Best Narrative Feature at the Charlotte Film Festival, as well as a Special Achievement in Directing award from the Florida International Film Festival. His third feature, *Loitering with Intent*, written by Michael Godere and Ivan Martin, stars Sam Rockwell, Marissa Tomei, Brian Geraghty, Godere, and Martin. *Loitering with Intent* was an Official Selection of the 2015 Tribeca Film Festival and was released by The Orchard.

For television, he has written and produced for *The L Word* (Showtime), *In Treatment* (HBO), *Flesh & Bone* (Starz), and *Vinyl* (HBO). He served as Executive Producer and Co-Showrunner for both *The Looming Tower* (Hulu) and *American Rust* (Showtime). He recently served as the Showrunner for Season Two of *American Rust* — *American Rust*: *Broken Justice* for Amazon Studios.

Born in Chicago and raised in nearby Joliet, Illinois, Mr. Rapp attended Clarke University in Dubuque, Iowa, where he was captain of the basketball team. After graduating, he spent six years working in book publishing before being able to support himself as a writer. In 2001, he completed the graduate playwriting program at Juilliard. He has taught at the Yale School of Drama, where he served as the Associate Chair of the Playwriting Program, and Wesleyan University.

Mr. Rapp has lived and worked in New York City since May of 1991. He currently splits his time between NYC and upstate New York.



Princess Grace Award Winners

The Princess Grace Awards identify and support extraordinary emerging artists in theater, dance, and film, recognizing creative generators (including but not limited to theater directors, designers, choreographers, and film directors) and performance-based creatives (including but not limited to actors and dancers); a Playwriting Fellowship is offered through a partnership with New Dramatists. Princess Grace Award winners receive an unrestricted cash grant, and are eligible for future exclusive grant opportunities with the Princess Grace Foundation.






